

FAQs Maccabi Sailing Week 2026

What do I need to know about the sailing boats and their facilities?

- The Sailing Week includes a flotilla of over 12 sailing vessels, boats 45-50 feet in size
- There are 4 to 5 cabins on the boats. The crews contain 8-10 people.
- At least two bathrooms (WC + shower), a kitchen with cooker, a fridge and a freezer are on board. No air conditioning on board in Croatia, no coffee machine
- Internet at sea mostly good. In Spain you can buy volume SIMs (cheap)
- You can hire a router separately (usually not necessary)
- 220 volts usually not available at sea (charge laptops, batteries and phones in the harbour)
- Bookable on site: SUP, barbecue

What is available in the marinas?

- Toilets, showers, electricity, water
- Possibly cafes, shops, ATMs, supermarkets, beach
- WiFi (mostly)

What previous knowledge do I need for Sailing Week?

- Previous knowledge is not necessary. Sailing know-how is learnt as much as possible.

What do I need to bring for Sailing Week?

- Light summer clothing, swimwear and a change of clothes.
- Light and sporty shoes (light sailing shoes are an advantage here) with a non-slip, white and non-marking sole are also required. I will send a link (example) to the info group for good and cheap sailing shoes.
- Evening dresses and high heels are not advisable on a sailing trip
- Sun cream
- Headgear such as caps, preferably with a safety clip
- Sun cream
- There are T-shirts and long-sleeved sailing clothing with UV protection, even cheap ones (link possible)
- Sunglasses
- Expensive glasses and caps must be secured to the head with clips and cords
- Sailing gloves, can send a link to the group
- Power bank useful
- Light windbreaker, light jumper, long trousers useful
- Possibly plasters
- Possibly seasickness medication (everything works)
- Medication can be cooled on board if necessary

Suitcases, bags, luggage storage in the harbour?

- Do not take suitcases on board, it is too cramped
- Bag or sports bag that can be rolled up or significantly reduced in size, rucksack
- If you are bringing suitcases for a longer stay in Croatia, you may be able to leave them with the charter company for a small fee. Take the necessary items with you on the boat. As this rule changes frequently, we will inquire about this separately

What about safety on board?

- A sailing trip is essentially safe
- The skipper's instructions must be strictly observed by all crew members.
- On the day of arrival, a briefing is given by the skipper and includes all relevant safety measures.
- Life jackets, seat belts, etc.

How much money do I need on site?

- The price includes boat hire, marina moorings and insurance.
- Other costs such as fuel, catering and travel are not included in the price.
- All additional costs of any kind incurred during the trip are also not included in the price and are covered by the on-board cash box.
- The on-board fund is a contribution by each crew member of a certain amount of money for the joint purchase of food, diesel, excursions or other purchases.
- Each crew decides the amount of the on-board fund for itself; it is usually €75 to €200 per person per week (usually €120/person), although a further contribution may be necessary
- The amount of the contribution essentially depends on whether cooking is done on board and how much alcohol is consumed. If the crew only goes out to eat, the on-board cash box is correspondingly small, but personal expenses are considerably higher.
- Prices in the restaurants are similar to those in Germany, food may be slightly cheaper.
